
Jean-Paul's Daring Adventure: Stories From Old Mobile

Address	Description
Way	Proposes a solution to a problem
Drive	Announces a new set of rules
Place	Sets boundaries for others' behavior
Circle	Announces the end of an issue
Lane	Discusses the past and compares to the "present"
Court	Someone flirting with or "courting" disaster or victory

There are many ways to develop your address, so be creative! 1. House Number Could be the year, place in document or something creative 2. Street Name The main point of the excerpt or speech condensed into one or two words 3. Type of Street The street designation, what the author is trying to do with the main point 4. Place Can be geographic location or something creative 5. State, Zip Real state/zip or something creative Put it all together following this format: House Number Street Name Type of Street Place State Zip
